## FOREST SCHOOLS PROGRAMME 2023 - 2024

We're delighted this year to be working closely with two Forest School leaders from Humber Forest School Ltd. From October they will be in school every Friday morning, leading outdoor sessions alongside our teaching staff. Each class from Year 1 - Year 6 will have three whole mornings when they will take part in a range of Forest School problem solving activities to develop and apply their bushcraft skills.

Well documented evidence based research shows that children through Forest School grow in selfconfidence, develop initiative and become more physically able as they take on challenges and projects in the outdoors. It helps to develop teamwork and social skills, along with a sense of community. Forest School enables children to try things out without the fear of failure. Often those who struggle to find a voice within the classroom, feel able to express their opinions and feelings when gathered around the campfire; whilst those who find concentrating difficult in a classroom, can spend well over an hour developing fire lighting skills or concentrating on whittling the "very best pointy stick"!

The lessons in the Autumn term are for Key Stage One, dates are listed below: Year 1 (Mary Seacole Class) - 6th/13th/20th/ October Year 1/2 (Frida Kahlo Class) - 27th October/10th/17th November Year 2 (Amy Johnson Class) - 24th November/1st December/8th December

The children will need to come to school wearing old clothes, have a waterproof coat, ideally also waterproof trousers if they have them, wellies, hat and gloves. They will need to bring their uniform to change into after the session.

We will be using some of our Sports Premium funding to subsidise the sessions although would welcome a donation/voluntary contribution of £10 to assist with the cost.
