EYFS Vision

'To empower our children to be independent, well rounded individuals who have a love of learning and seek challenge in everything they do.'

As Mathematicians we will be: selecting and counting objects, identifying numbers, matching numerals and quantities correctly.

We will be practicing counting numbers in sequence to 20 and will be using language such as 'more' and 'a lot'.

We will be experimenting with representing numbers and will be looking at numbers that are important to us and that are in and around our environment.

We will be using Numicon to help us as well as flashcards, songs and various objects both inside and out.



As part of our Physical Development we will be: using our gross motor skills to practise our co-ordination skills by using balls to throw and catch, by climbing, jumping and dancing.

We will be using writing tools in and outside of the classroom to enhance our fine motor skills.

We will have the opportunity to handle lots of different equipment, materials and tools such as scissors, staplers, playdoh, tweezers.



As authors and readers we will be: learning new phonemes (letter sounds) and learning how to write them correctly. We will use our phonic knowledge when writing sentences and words. We will also use our phonics to help us read exciting books. This term we will be focusing mainly on phase 2 phonemes.

We will listen to a variety of stories anticipating what might happen next, as well as joining in with songs and rhymes.



To have more understanding of the world we will: We will enjoy playing with familiar objects such as farms, garages and train tracks. We will explore our role play areas and will be encouraged to talk about our own home life, cultures and traditions. We will think about how and why things happen and how things work.

We will be looking at different plants and animals through our school trip visit to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park and will begin to talk about how to care for living things in different environments.

Through Art and Design we will: explore and use media and materials both indoors and outdoors to explore a variety of Art & Design, Drama, Dance and Music activities.

We will experiment creating props to support role play and use media and materials imaginatively.

As confident and capable individuals: we will be encouraged to develop all aspects of the personal, social and emotional development.

We will: Tidy up at 'tidy-time' and take pride in our school; Put on our own coat and ask for help from our friends if we need it; Solve problems by ourselves before we ask an adult; Take turns at sharing. We will discuss feelings / Class rules / Starting School / How are we different and how are we all the same? How do we behave in different situations and environments? How do we behave in school? How do we treat other people?

The role play area will be set up as a home corner. The focus of our play will getting to know each other and learning to play cooperatively together. The role-play will provide opportunities for the children to replicate home experiences and dressing up in a variety of clothes.
