

Primary PE and Sport Premium

At **Eloughton Primary School** we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding until 2020 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed in using this resource to develop our high quality PE lessons, alongside creating greater opportunities for our young people to participate in sporting competitions and clubs.

Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11). All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £7,535 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £475 per pupil.

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What does the Sport Premium mean for our School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013). At **Eloughton** we have split up the funding by the three key areas; Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport. We have decided to spend the Sport Premium Grant on the following:

Physical Education Raising the standard of teaching and learning in PE

<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers in EYFS and KS1</i>	We have invested £1020 on curriculum support (teaching invasion games) from the Tigers Trust. Each staff member (Reception and KS1) receive 5 hours of observing and team teaching with a highly qualified sports coach.	<i>All teachers are more confident in delivering high quality invasion games lessons at KS 1. Children are developing enhanced sports specific skills and improvements in physical literacy have been observed.</i>
<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers.</i>	<i>We invested £419 in staff training in gymnastics. The training was provided by Gary Kirby from British Gymnastics.</i>	<i>All teachers are more confident in delivering high quality gymnastics sessions. The Year 6 gymnastics performance to parents showcased the improved teaching standards.</i>
<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers.</i>	<i>We invested £40 on staff training (F.A Youth Module 2) for Mr Jenkinson as he has delivered P.E lessons (one of their two hours per week) for Years 2-5 this year.</i>	<i>Mr Jenkinson's P.E lessons have been consistently outstanding this year. Ensuring that Years 2-5 received high quality P.E exposure.</i>

<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers.</i>	<i>We invested £100 in the Chance2Shine cricket foundation. This meant that staff in Years 3, 4 and 5 received two hours of cricket coach development (per staff member). It also ensured every child in Year 3, 4 and 5 received two hours of cricket coaching.</i>	<i>This investment has increased the quality of cricket teaching in Years 3, 4 and 5. Also, it allowed us to access further cricket competitions.</i>
<i>Increase the quality and range of gymnastics equipment.</i>	<i>We spent £2636.68 on gymnastics equipment.</i>	<i>New equipment has only just been received (we are still awaiting some of the new equipment) so it is too early to gauge the impact. However, it is already generating a lot of excitement amongst staff and pupils.</i>

Healthy Active Lifestyles

<i>Improve the quality of sports resources in the school.</i>	<i>We have invested £1913.25 in new sporting equipment. This includes the portable floodlights and the electrical work needed for their safe operation.</i>	<i>This investment has helped ensure that our children have access to quality equipment. Also, the investment in portable floodlights has ensured after-school sporting clubs can run throughout the winter months. Thus ensuring more children participate in regular exercise.</i>
<i>Provide playground footballs for the children (at their request).</i>	<i>We invested £44.95 in specialist playground footballs for the children.</i>	<i>This helped ensure every child could access at least one football per year group.</i>
<i>Continue to Improve the playing surface of the field.</i>	<i>We spent £480 on repairing the playing surface of the field and also ensuring it was marked out correctly for various sports matches and festivals.</i>	<i>Improved the learning environment which subsequently increased the quality of the learning. It also allowed us to host sporting fixtures at the school.</i>
<i>Provide lunch-time and after-school sports activities.</i>	<i>We spent £660.12 overtime so qualified coach's can assist Chris Marsden in delivering lunch-time and after-school sports clubs.</i>	<i>We have dramatically increased the number of children participating in both lunch-time and after-school sporting activities.</i>

<i>Increase the amount of competitive sport opportunities for pupils</i>	<i>We spent £1500 on membership to the local School Sports Partnership / SGO competition calendar in order to access good quality inter competition. We invested in qualified coach's to attend sports events when Chris Marsden was at staff meetings. In addition, the investment in Tigers' Trust allowed us to access further competitions. Furthermore, we invested £50 in the East Riding Schools Football Association so that we could access their competitions.</i>	<i>An increase in the number of opportunities open to pupils in KS2 All children in Year 6 participated in at least three extra-curricular sporting events last year. All Year 5 pupils participated in at least one extra-curricular sporting event. More Year 2, 3 and 4 children participated in extra-curricular sport. Achievement of Bronze School Games mark.</i>

Currently we have £436 of the Sports Premium remaining. This will be spent before the end of August. This money will be spent on: athletics equipment for sports day, sports day medals, a new sports day trophy and overtime for Tim Price and Lewis Jenkinson so that they can attend sports events when Chris Marsden is at any staff meetings.

Going beyond the Sports Premium

At Elloughton, sport plays a huge role in the development of both the school and its pupils. As a result, we have invested (from the schools staffing budget not the sports premium) in Lewis Jenkinson who has delivered an hour of P.E each week to Year 2, 3, 4 and 5. This has brought about significant development in the children's sporting abilities.

Also, every member of teaching staff (excluding Chris Marsden who already holds the qualification) has completed the Football Association Primary Teachers Award. This involved staff observing a Football Association coach mentor for four hours before completing a theory pack and a final observed lesson. This also, provided children from EYFS to Year 5 with an additional four hours of high quality P.E teaching.

As the school is currently experiencing a changing teaching force we will re-run this programme for all new staff in September to ensure consistency in the teaching of invasion games.

Furthermore, Year 2 children and staff have received an hour of tennis development from the LTA and the Nuffield Tennis academy.
