

Primary PE and Sport Premium Forecast

2016/17

At **Elloughton Primary School** we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding until 2020 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed in using this resource to develop our high quality PE lessons, alongside creating greater opportunities for our young people to participate in sporting competitions and clubs.

Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11). All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £7,535 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £475 per pupil.

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What does the Sport Premium mean for our School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013). At **Elloughton** we have split up the funding by the three key areas; Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport. We have decided to spend the Sport Premium Grant on the following:

Physical Education Raising the standard of teaching and learning in PE		
What are we going to do?	How will we do it?	What was the impact?
<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers in EYFS and KS1</i>	We plan to invest £500 on curriculum support (teaching invasion games). This will cover the cost of Mr Marsden being released from class to team-team.	
<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers.</i>	<i>We will invest a further £419 in staff training in gymnastics. The training was provided by Gary Kirby from British Gymnastics.</i>	.
<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers.</i>	<i>We will access training courses provided by the YST and East Riding SSP (West) to up skill staff.</i>	
<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers.</i>	<i>We will invest £1000.00 on release time for Mr Marsden so that he can team-teach gymnastics with all teaching staff in the school.</i>	

<i>Increase the quality and range of gymnastics equipment.</i>	<i>We will spend £1000 to further enhance gymnastics equipment.</i>	

Healthy Active Lifestyles Ensuring all children are encouraged to take regular exercise		
What are we going to do?	How will we do it?	What was the impact?
<i>Improve the quality of sports resources in the school.</i>	<i>We will invest £2411.05 in new sporting equipment. This will include: new netball posts, new footballs, rugby balls, netballs, two basketball hoops, a new netball kit, a new football kit and two sets of seven a side football goals.</i>	
<i>Provide playground footballs for the children (at their request).</i>	<i>We will invest £44.95 in specialist playground footballs for the children. As the ones ordered last year have worn out.</i>	
<i>Continue to Improve the playing surface of the field.</i>	<i>We will need to spend £500 on repairing the playing surface of the field (damage caused by the chafer grub) and also ensuring it was marked out correctly for various sports matches and festivals.</i>	
<i>Provide lunch-time and after-school sports activities.</i>	<i>We will need to spend £2000 in overtime so qualified coach's can assist Chris Marsden in delivering lunch-time and after-school sports clubs.</i>	

Competitive School Sport Increase participation levels in extracurricular sport		
What are we going to do?	How did we do it?	What was the impact?
<i>Increase the amount of competitive sport opportunities for pupils</i>	<i>We will spend £1500 on membership to the local School Sports Partnership / SGO competition calendar in order to access good quality inter competition.</i>	

	<i>Furthermore, we will invest £50 in the East Riding Schools Football Association so that we can access their competitions.</i>	
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Due to the extensive damage caused to the school field by the chafer grub we may need to invest more in repairing the school field.

Going beyond the Sports Premium

At Elloughton, sport plays a huge role in the development of both the school and its pupils. As a result, we will continue to invest (from the schools staffing budget not the sports premium) in Lewis Jenkinson who will deliver an hour of P.E each week to Year 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.
