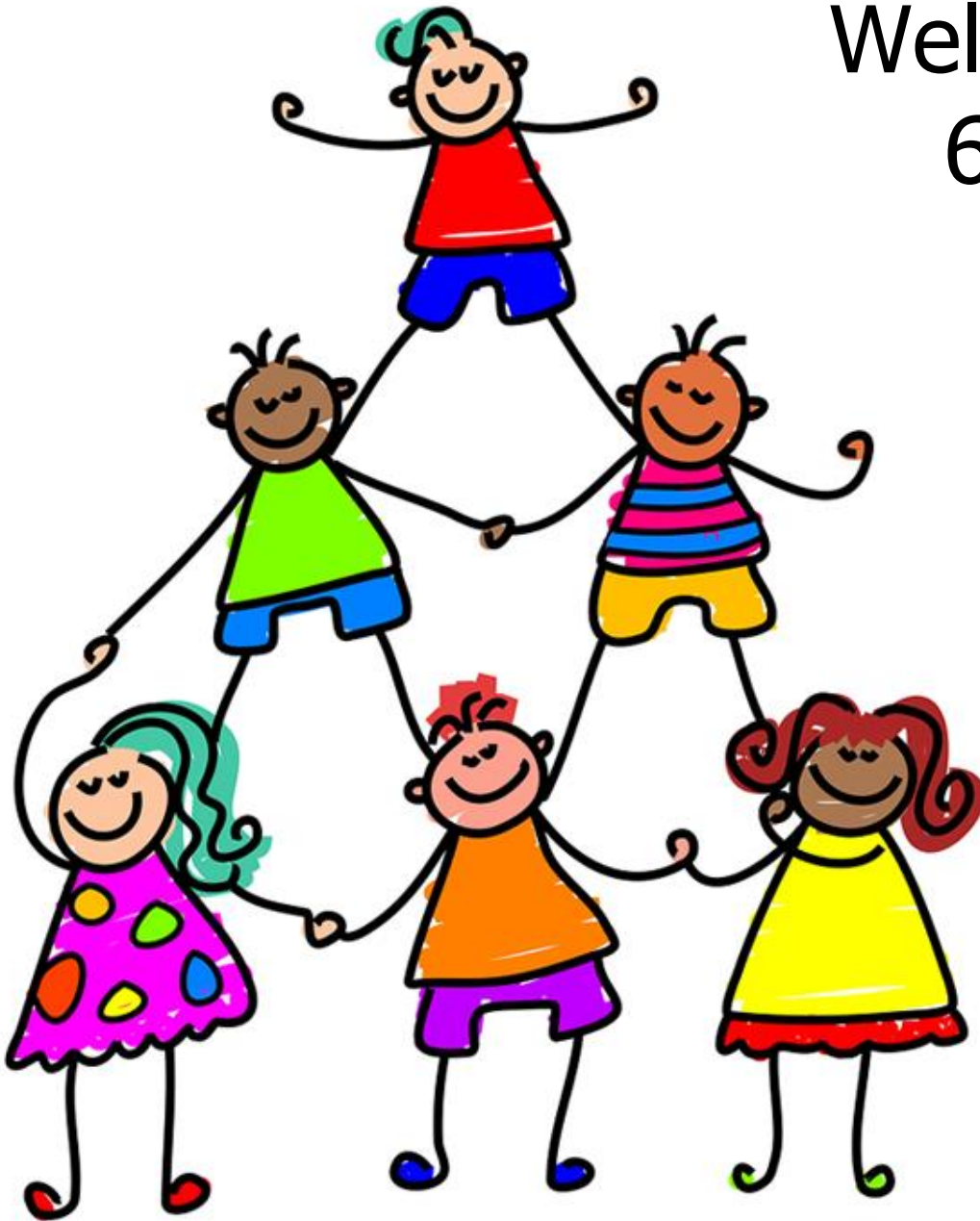


Welcome to the Year 6 SATS Parents Evening





What are SATS?

SATS are National Curriculum tests which are taken at the end of key stages in schools in England.

The Tests

Your child will take 6 tests during the week of May 14th.

These tests will be in Maths and English.

Date	Activity
Monday 14 May	English grammar, punctuation and spelling papers 1 and 2
Tuesday 15 May	English reading
Wednesday 16 May	Mathematics papers 1 and 2
Thursday 17 May	Mathematics paper 3



What are SATS?

English Reading Test

Your child will be given a booklet with 3 texts within it. The texts get progressively harder. They will need to read this booklet and use it to help answer questions.

Question Types

- give / explain the meaning of words in context
- retrieve and record information
- summarise main ideas from more than one paragraph
- make inferences from the text / explain and justify inferences with evidence from the text
- predict what might happen from details stated and implied
- identify / explain how information / narrative content is related and contributes to meaning as a whole
- identify / explain how meaning is enhanced through choice of words and phrases
- make comparisons within the text



What are SATS?

The Maths Tests

Arithmetic Paper (Paper 1)

Multiplication, addition, subtraction and division using decimals, fractions and percentages.

Reasoning Papers (Paper 2 &3)

Covers all areas of maths in worded problems.

All papers use maths taught from Year 3 -6.





How are the results used?

- By Elloughton

To monitor the progress made by your child across the key stage.

To highlight any areas for further development for your child.

- By Your Child's New School

To put them into sets for maths.

To ensure a mixed ability class for other subjects.

To inform teachers of any other additional learning requirements of your child.

To give indications of your child's potential at GCSE.



How do we help to prepare the children?

- Class Time

During the spring term your child's lessons will continue to teach the year 6 content, revise work from previous years and refine skills such as working to time limits; reading questions carefully and giving effective answers.

- Lunch Time Home Learning Support

These sessions will happen weekly on a Monday. Your child can come along if they need help with a particular topic that is being covered or just need a quiet space to complete something they haven't had time to finish.

- Home Learning

The children will all be given 3 new revision books. English, Maths and Reading. They will be set work from each to complete every week. They are all in the same style as SATs questions to get them used to the format.

- Revision Sessions

Tuesday & Wednesday 8:15 – 8:45

A timetable of sessions will be coming home and you can sign your child up for the sessions which they wish to attend.



How can you help your child?

How you can help:

- Encourage them to be organised
- Give them a suitable environment – no TV, a table or desk!
- Help them to break their home learning into manageable chunks
- Ensure there is plenty of time for sleep, relaxation and most importantly fun

The Timetable

- The reasons for testing
- To show where your child is working at in relation to age related expectations.
- To help their new school plan to meet their future learning needs.

- The Results
- Once the tests have been sent away and marked your child will get a scaled score for each subject. To pass the children will need to get 100 or more as a scaled score. If they get 100 or more they will get a statement which says they are 'Working at age related expectations'.
