

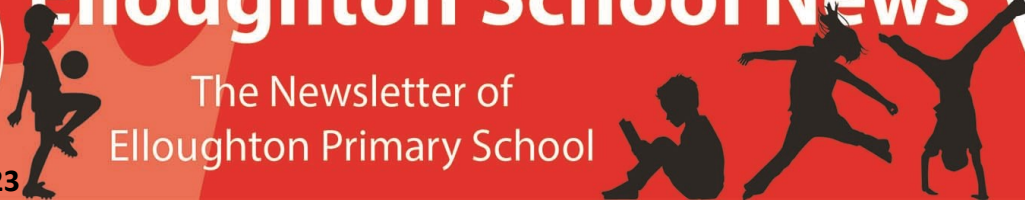

Word from the Headteacher

Once again It has been a delight to welcome everyone back to school after the summer break. The first few weeks have been full of positivity with the children so enthusiastic, keen and happy to be reunited with friends, settling well into their new classes. A special welcome to all our new staff and children who have joined us in nursery, EYFS and other year groups. They have all made a fantastic start and quickly adapted quickly to the daily routines of daily school life.

Life during the summer holidays was extremely busy with lots of premises development to further improve the school buildings and grounds and enhance the learning environment. The reconstruction of the hall was completed and the teaching kitchen was refurbished. The hall now looks very different (the water stained ceiling tiles have now gone and we no longer need buckets and paddling pools to catch the rain water!). Further work is to take place during October half term to refurbish the hall floor and fit new external doors. Thankfully the Local Authority has fully funded all this much needed work.



Internal developments also took place to set up our new Treehouse provision, an additional space in school to support children who have social communication difficulties. Within this area we have incorporated a Dark Den, a small sensory room and different areas for learning. In addition we have restyled our SMILE room and The Nest, where Mrs Robbins and Mrs Dakin (our Emotional Literacy Support Assistants) provide social and emotional support for pupils. Both rooms provide a quiet, relaxing and calming space for children when needed.

The excitement of OPAL play has really taken off this term and playtimes have been transformed. I'm sure you may have heard the children talk about all their new playtime adventures! We're delighted to now have a new play shed and along with a refurbished shelter and welly storage in and around school. Special thanks to FESA for their generous donation to support our exciting new project. We also really appreciate all the wonderful items that parents have donated as we continue to work hard to make playtimes engaging, inspiring and inclusive. Remember your waste is our treasure! The creation of our new giant sandpit is our next exciting project and we hope the Colour Run event will provide much needed funds.



So as we embark on the new school year we look forward to all the children's achievements, both big and small, Myself and staff will continue working closely with you all as 2023/2024 promises to be fulfilling and successful. Thank you for your continued support as together we ensure Elloughton is a wonderful place for all our children to grow, thrive and flourish.

Opal Play

Lunchtimes are truly transforming at Elloughton. OPAL play is in full swing. Over the summer we have seen the addition of the mud kitchen, rope swing and boat. Children are enjoying the wheeled toys area, the water area, den budding, dress up.



We believe that: *“Play is freely chosen, personally directed, intrinsically motivated behaviour that actively engages the child. Play can be fun or serious. Through play children explore social, material and imaginary worlds and their relationship with them, elaborating all the while a flexible range of responses to the challenges they encounter. By playing, children learn and develop as individuals, and as members of the community.”*

Results from the Parent survey

100% of parents feel play is extremely or very important. When you asked your children what they didn't like about playtime they said:

Our lunchtime playtimes are developing skills like resilience, perseverance, social interaction, self control, respect, independence, risk management, negotiating, teamwork to name just a few!

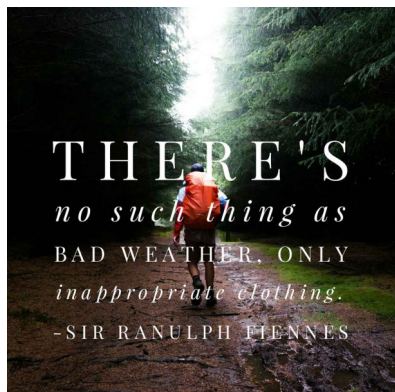
Just be aware that your child may come home a little messy

As a 'Teeth friendly' school we only allow water in bottles for drinking during lessons, not juice or flavoured water.



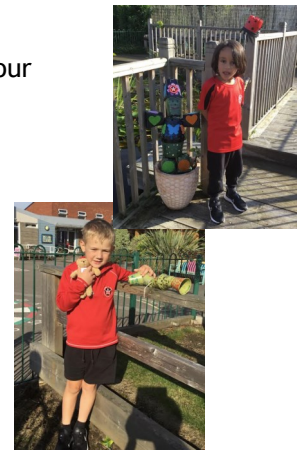
Britain in Bloom
