#### Let Girls Play

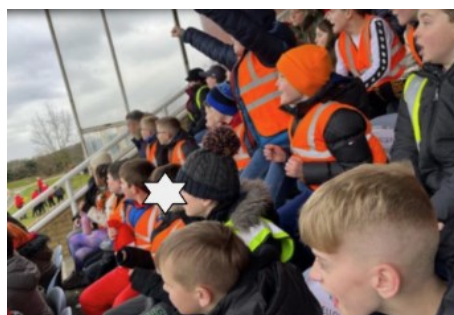

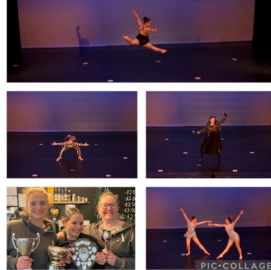

A super achievement!

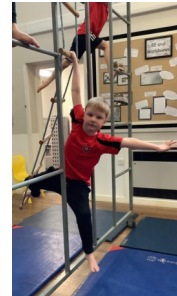

## Physical Activity

### Active Lunchtimes

During lunchtimes we aim to keep the children as active as possible, whatever the weather! Each class, through EYFS, KS1 & KS2 have a tub with various equipment such as different sized balls, scoops & balls, skipping ropes, tennis rackets. This enables the children to create their own games and play independently.

We have the pick up sticks and bars on the back playground for KS2 and the pirate ship, trim trail and the monkey bars at the front for KS1. The children hang from these, making adults' heads spin!

In the MUGA, Mr Jenkinson provides a varied choice of activities, including dodgeball, capture the flag, football, netball, tag rugby & hockey. This gives a high number of both boys and girls from Years 3-6 a chance to learn to mix with both older and younger children, whilst also encouraging teamwork and respect.

We have the Walk & Talk path around the outer edge of the field, which goes through Ali's Garden. This encourages the children to walk and talk and appreciate the school grounds, whilst increasing their daily steps, in all weathers.

In addition, we have several Giant Jengas. Children build towers and create numerous shapes, including chairs and tables, ships and cars, along with 'small world' play for KS1.

We have adults on both playgrounds who help by suggesting and creating games with the children. There are team building activities including den building & relay races along with more traditional playground games. We even get the children dressing up at times!
