At **Elloughton Primary School** we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding until 2020 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We continue to be committed to use this resource to develop our high quality PE lessons, alongside creating greater opportunities for our young people to participate in sporting competitions and clubs.

What does the Sport Premium mean for our School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013). At **Elloughton Primary School** we have split up the funding by the three key areas; Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport. We have decided to spend the Sport Premium Grant on the following:

<i>Invest in the continuous professional development of teachers.</i>	<i>All teaching staff will attend a CPD workshop on making P.E inclusive for all students. This will be funded via the £1750 subscription to the School Sports Partnership.</i>	All teachers and a number of support staff now have more ideas and a new confidence to deliver fun, challenging and all-inclusive active lessons.
<i>Continue to Improve the playing surface of the field.</i>	<i>We will use £9000 of the Sports Premium to subsidise the £40,000 cost of a MUGA.</i>	<i>The MUGA has enabled PE sessions to go ahead in all weathers plus given the pupils many extracurricular opportunities.</i>

<i>Improve the quality of sports resources in the school.</i>	<i>We will invest in new sporting equipment. This will include: new footballs, rugby balls, a new football kit and two sets of seven a side football goals.</i>	<i>New equipment has enabled lessons to be more active, inclusive and of high quality due to the new and fit for purpose equipment.</i>
<i>Provide playground footballs for the children (at their request).</i>	<i>We will invest in specialist playground footballs for the children.</i>	Increased participation and interest across all year groups.
<i>Continue to Improve the playing surface of the field.</i>	<i>We will use £9000 of the Sports Premium to subsidise the £40,000 cost of a MUGA.</i>	<i>Levels of interest and participation have hugely increased across the school, more children are now physically active.</i>

<i>Provide lunch-time and after-school sports activities.</i>	<i>We will need to spend £2000 in overtime so our qualified coach, Mr Jenkinson, can deliver lunch-time activities and after-school sports clubs.</i>	<i>The school now have approximately 60 children in varied organised games over lunch time. After school sports clubs have given children opportunities to develop within the school environment.</i>

<i>Increase the amount of competitive sport opportunities for pupils</i>	<i>We will spend £1750 on membership to the local School Sports Partnership / SGO competition calendar in order to access good quality inter competition.</i> <i>Furthermore, we will invest £50 in the East Riding Schools Football Association so that we can access their competitions.</i>	<i>For the second year running we achieved the Gold School Games Mark. All Year 6 children participated in at least three extra-curricular sporting events. Year 5 participated in one event whilst there was provision for Year 2,3 and 4 children to take part in extracurricular activities.</i>

Going beyond the Sports Premium

At Elloughton Primary School, sport plays a huge role in the development of both the school and its pupils. As a result, we will continue to invest (from the school's staffing budget not the Sports Premium) in Mr Jenkinson who will deliver an hour of P.E each week to Year: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.
