So 2023 is now well and truly underway. We have also welcomed some new nursery children into school. It's been lovely to see them settle so quickly into life at 'big'

As always it's been a busy start to the term with new curriculum themes being launched, educational visits taking place to Murton Park, Eureka and the Thackray medical museum, the intensive swimming programme beginning for Year 3 as well as parents being welcomed into school for Coffee & Chat, Stay & Reads and SEND

support plan meetings.



The first week back saw many children take part in Young Voices concert in Sheffield, joining with over 5,000 pupils from all over the region, to form the largest school choir in the world. Once again the children were a real credit to us, eager to practise and so enthusiastic to sing and perform with others. Many thanks to Mrs Bennett who organised the event and who continually encourages a real love of singing. The children, and parents, had a wonderful night to remember, singing and dancing, clearly enjoying the occasion.

It's was lovely to welcome parents to our most recent 'Coffee and Chat' session with Gill Jagger from Aim Higher talking about autism and giving

us an opportunity to discuss how we can work together to support children and their families. Our meetings with parents for children who have additional needs also proved invaluable as staff and parents discussed individuals target and programmes to support their children.



So I know our work in school is never done. I am privileged to work with such a dedicated team of staff and I am often taken aback by the huge effort that our entire team put into making school run smoothly each and every day. Alongside this, the work on our curriculum and teaching is continually being reviewed as staff strive to ensure the children at Elloughton get the best deal we can give them.

Design and Technology at Elloughton Primary by Jenny Godfrey (DT Leader)

Design and Technology develops children's skills and knowledge in design, structures, mechanisms, electrical control and a range of materials, including food.

As part of their work with food, children are taught how to cook and apply the principles of nutrition and healthy eating. Learning how to cook is a crucial life skill which is why it is taught in every year group.

Already this academic year, there have been some great projects happening in Food and Nutrition. Our youngest children have enjoyed making scones during their Stay and Cook session whilst the Year 1 children served soup at their Winter Warmer Cafe. The parents and carers of the children in Year 2 were treated to an array of dips and dippers whilst Year 5 and 6 impressed their visitors with Mexican-inspired tacos and side dishes. 
