A Word From The Headteacher

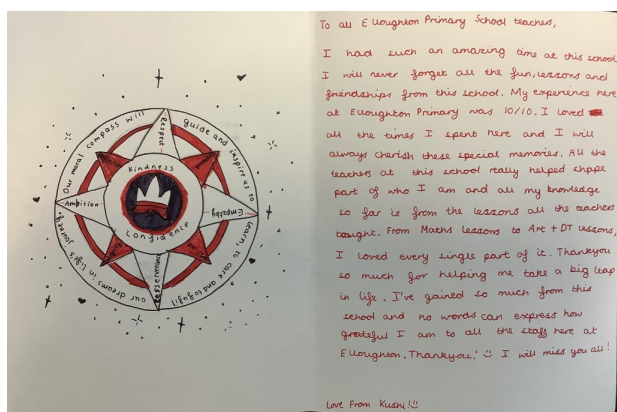

Online ordering - if you already know the sizes of the uniform then please use our online ordering system www.rawcliffes.co.uk - please allow up to 14 working days and the order will be ship safely by courier to your designated address. Please check the size guideline section to help you measure your child and check our refunds and exchange policy. (95% of online orders are shipped the next day but if we are required to order in certain sizes then please allow up to 14 working days)

Customer limits in the shop - We will only be allowed to have a certain amount of customers as per the government guidelines in the stores during our busy periods.

A queuing system will be in place during the very busy periods.
