A Word From The Headteacher

What a busy few weeks we've had and I'm sure many of the children are now all ready for a well earned break. A special well done to our Year 2s who have just completed reading and maths quizzes (alias KS1 SATs) and to all our Year 6 who recently took their KS2 SATs. Despite not being keen on the government's national testing regime I'm so proud of how all our children took the tests in their stride and did their very best, something which we continually encourage.

Particular thanks to the Year 6 staff and parents for ensuring the children were as prepared as they could be. The reading test this year has caused huge controversy leading some school leaders calling for testing reform. This is not because of the content but because of the length of the texts and the difficulty of the questions. Given the impact the pandemic will have had on this cohort of pupils, it is no wonder so many have raised concerns about the difficulty of the paper.

Fortunately we didn't, like some schools, have pupils feeling overwhelmed, upset and stressed with the paper. On the contrary all our children coped so well, despite the challenges and angst that tests can cause. I'm confident in the knowledge that the children all worked hard and completed the tests to the best of their ability which is all we ever expect. We teach the children to be skilled, knowledgeable, well rounded individuals to prepare them for future life. Confidence, creativity, respect, resilience, collaboration, integrity, thoughtfulness cannot be measured by SATs. Each and every day all the pupils make me proud as they enjoy learning and discovering together, showing many of our core values. It's a delight to have so many conversations with pupils whether that be a cheery hello in the morning, a polite greeting in the corridor, a conversation in the lunch queue, sharing thoughts in assembly or discussing their work. Your children are wonderful ambassadors for our school and it's a privilege to work with them. Visitors to our school are often impressed by the warm, welcoming and purposeful atmosphere that together they create. We're definitely all 'Proud to be Elloughton.'


When we return to school in June I'm sure our Year 1 children will smash the statutory phonic testing and Year 4s will excel in the multiplication table check.

PSHE at Elloughton Primary School by Hannah Stillings & Rebecca Brammall

Our PSHE curriculum is composed of six core pieces which are taught during each half term.













In each classroom the children have a floorbook which captures discussions, pupil voice and learning within lessons. In the Spring Term, all pupils focused on 'Healthy Me'. The table below shows the progression of learning.

Early Years

The children in Early Years learnt to name parts of their body and discuss what their bodies need to keep healthy (exercise, sleep, hand washing). They also discussed saying 'No strangers' and what to do if they get lost.



Year 1

Year 1 pupils explored how to keep healthy through

making healthy lifestyle choices. They learnt that it is important to keep themselves clean and how germs can cause disease. They also discussed how to keep themselves safe near roads.

Year 2

Pupils in Year 2 discussed ways to help our bodies stay

healthy; having a healthy relationship with food and making healthy choices. They discussed ways to help them feel calm and how to use medicines safely.



Year 3

The Year 3 children talked about the importance of exercise and

how it helps their bodies to stay healthy. They also talked about their heart and lungs and how they work and why they are very important. The children also discussed different types of drugs.





Year 4

Year 4 explored the effects of smoking and alcohol on health and learnt about the reasons why people may drink or smoke. They also considered their friendships and talked about peer pressure and how to manage this.



Voar

Year 5 pupils looked at the risks associated with smoking and how this affects the lungs, liver and heart. They also explored risks associated with alcohol misuse. They were taught a range of basic emergency procedures and how to contact emergency services when needed. Finally, Year 5 discussed how body types are explored in the media, social media and celebrity culture. They talked about eating disorders and people's relationships with food and how this can be linked to negative body image pressures.


Year 6

Year 6 pupils explored how their choices benefit their own health and wellbeing. They discussed different types of drugs and their uses. They learnt that some people can be exploited and can be made to do things against the law which may include joining a 'gang'. They also learnt the triggers and feelings of being stressed and the strategies they can use, to help them.

After May half term, we will be moving onto 'Changing Me' which incorporates the RSE (Relationship and Sex Education) curriculum. Please pop and see your child's class teacher if you have any questions.




Thank you to all who donated for to Bags2School, we raised £93.00.
