<p>On Track to be at least Dark Blue book band by the end of Year 5.</p> <p>Highlighted statements denote non negotiables for Elloughton Primary School ie: the very large majority of children will leave Year 3 being able to do these things confidently.</p>
<p>Working at the expected standard</p>
<p>Word Reading and Fluency</p>
<p>Apply their knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes (etymology and morphology) to understand the meaning of new words.</p>
<p>Read accurately and fluently, with confidence, age related texts which include unfamiliar words (90 words per minute)</p>
<p>Use dictionaries to improve accuracy and fluency</p>
<p>Comprehension</p>
<p>Explain the meaning of new words in context (2a)</p>
<p>Retrieve, record and present information from fiction and non-fiction texts (2b)</p>
<p>Summarise the main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph (2c)</p>
<p>Make, explain and justify inferences using evidence from the text (2d)</p>
<p>Distinguish between statements of fact and opinion</p>
<p>Predict what may happen from details stated and implied (2e)</p>
<p>Identify and explain how information / narrative content is related and contributes to meaning as a whole (2f)</p>
<p>Identify and discuss themes and conventions within a genre</p>
<p>Identify / explain how meaning is enhanced through choice of words and phrases (2g)</p>
<p>Discuss how authors use language, including figurative language, considering the impact on the reader</p>
<p>Identify some grammatical features and how they impact on the reader e.g. rhetorical questions, variation of sentence length</p>
<p>Skim and scan texts</p>
<p>Make comparisons within and across books (2h)</p>
<p>Recommend texts giving reasons</p>
<p>Working at greater depth within the expected standard</p>
<p>Comprehension</p>
<p>Justify opinions and inferences with relevant evidence and explanation. Show an ability to adapt opinions based on further evidence (2d)</p>
<p>Identify and discuss themes and conventions in and across a wide range of genres</p>
<p>Explain the writers' use of language, grammatical features and punctuation to create effects and impact, using explicit evidence from the text</p>
